We are happy to invite you to the 5th International Joint Seminar of St. Lukas Clinic, EAMHID, NEED and the Prof. Anton Došen Foundation. During some of our previous symposiums, the basic concept of emotional development (ED) according to Prof. Dr. Anton Došen (SEO) was presented in detail. This symposium will now focus on advanced aspects of ED. For this we have been able to secure internationally renowned experts as speakers. First *Rahela Došen* will refer to the legacy of Prof. Dr. Anton Došen and the mission of the Prof. Anton Došen Foundation. *Leen De Neve and Filip Morisse* will demonstrate the meaning of ED for front-line staff caring for clients with IDD. *Els Ronsse* will talk about aspects of ED and comorbid autism in day-to-day care of people with IDD. *Jolanda Vonk* will show the relevance of sexuality in the context of ED in the primary care of people with IDD. The lectures offer a high degree of practical relevance and are aimed at all professionals serving people with IDD, but especially at front-line staff providing primary care to clients with intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD).
